# PROPOSITION TO UTILIZE CAPITAL RESERVE

**Updates** April 8, 2025

### WHAT IS A CAPITAL RESERVE?

- The Capital Reserve was established to fund larger capital expenditures that could not be supported in the annual general fund budget and are typically smaller than projects that are included in a capital bond project. This reserve is one of our several reserve funds, each having a specific purpose.
- The District established our capital reserve in 2015 to fund up to \$1,500,000 and increased it to \$10,000,000 in 2023. The establishment of the reserve fund was voter approved.
- The reserve is funded through annual budget surpluses that are not allocated to other reserves, appropriations for following year budget, encumbrances or our undesignated fund balance.
- These funds can only be used for capital improvements.
- As of June 2024, the Capital Reserve amount is \$4,034,571 which includes funding and interest revenue.

#### WHAT DID THE DISTRICT ENVISION USING THIS RESERVE FOR?

The District initially planned on using this reserve for the turf and track replacement knowing they have an approximate 10 year life span. Funds were also added to tackle other projects that are part of our long range facilities plan. The use of a reserve saves the District money as it eliminates the need to borrow and pay interest. Instead, the District is accruing interest on the funds in the reserve account.

#### **HOW CAN THE CAPITAL RESERVE FUND BE ACCESSED?**

To spend from the Capital Reserve, voters must approve the spending via a proposition on a ballot. The vote can occur at any time of the year. We propose adding this proposition to the May 20th Budget/ Board Trustee election vote versus holding a separate vote for this purpose to not incur additional vote costs.

# THE PROPOSITION FOR MAY 20 WILL BE TO SPEND \$3,950,000 FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

- Replacement of the Meszaros Turf Field \*
- Resurfacing the Peter Oley Track
- Addition of Field Lights for the Track and Field
- Paving and refurbishment of the Dows Lane Basketball Court and Peaceful Play area
- Paving the Middle School Basketball Court
- Removal of outdated casework (cabinetry) in many High School classrooms
- Renovation of a student bathroom at the High School
- Concrete repairs District-wide
- Window replacements at the Middle School

The amount proposed is based on estimates for the work listed above. If costs exceed approved spending, it is possible that not all the work can be completed. \* Also includes costs of recycling existing turf.

These play areas are in need of repair and repaving. We will be reviewing possibilities for expansion of recreational uses.



#### WILL SPENDING FROM THIS RESERVE INCREASE TAXES?

This spending will strictly come from the funds set aside in the Capital Reserve and will not impact the tax levy or tax rate. Unlike a Capital Bond Project/Proposition, there is no borrowing associated with using the funds in the Reserve.

#### WHEN WILL THE WORK BE COMPLETED?

After a successful vote, the District will work with our Architects to create the specifications needed to submit to the State Education Department so we can receive building permits and eventually state aid on projects that are aidable. This will take several months. Our best estimate is to plan on work commencing the **Summer of 2026**. It is possible that once we have permits and can bid out the work, some of this work might be able to get done over a break period.

We will look to minimize construction cost which also means grouping similar work together (such as all paving and concrete repair) to get a favorable bid.




# Capital Reserve Spending Proposition

## When will the lights on Meszaros Field be in use?

- The District intends to use the lights primarily for Irvington Athletics
- The latest lights would be on are 9:30 pm weekdays and 10:00 pm for Friday/Saturday use, inclusive of cleanup time
- Irvington Rec/Youth Sports may apply to use the field lights
- The months of lights use will be August, September, October, November, March, April and May
- The District will publish a schedule of events where the Field Lights will be in use on the District website ahead of each season

Upon approval of the capital reserve proposition and installation of the field lights, the Facilities Use Policy/Regulation will be revised accordingly.





## **HOW WILL WE MANAGE EVENTS?**

- The District is cognizant that events may create traffic and noise and will take measures to mitigate any potential issues from field use
- For larger scale events, the District intends to disallow parking on Heritage Hill Road
- Outdoor PA system use will be restricted to School Athletics contests
- Custodial staff are on hand for cleanup and more trash and recycling receptacles will be placed in area.

### **CURRENT BUDGET ESTIMATES**

- Cost of the lights \$666,750 which includes Dark Sky compliance
- Electrical \$350,000 We anticipate less here.

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- Community feedback was solicited from nearby neighbors at a meeting on March 5
- Dr. Ratesic presented the Capital Reserve Proposition to the PTSA, IEF and Booster Club committees at their March meetings in addition to presenting at the March 11 and March 25 Board Meetings.
- The District shared an FAQ document addressing questions or concerns and posted this on the District website. This document will be updated throughout the process ahead of the May 20 vote.
- The Board and District heard comments and concerns at the March 11 and March 25
  Board meetings and will continue to do so at meetings ahead of the vote.
- The Board and District have responded and will continue to respond to emails.
- Community feedback will be further gathered at the other scheduled Budget Presentations given at various community locations (Senior Center, Village Hall, and the PTSA)
