In addition to grades provided by your child's teachers, we recognize that one of the ways that parents monitor their children's progress in school is through external assessments such as the New York State Assessments in ELA and Mathematics, the New York State Regents and Advanced Placement exams. This document is provided to give you information about the current status of these exams:

NEW YORK STATE ASSESSMENTS

The New York State Department of Education has suspended the following assessments for the remainder of the school year. This means that these assessments will not be given in 2020, but are expected to resume in 2021. For more information please see click <u>here</u>.

NEW YORK STATE REGENTS EXAMINATIONS

The New York State Department of Education has not yet provided information regarding Regents Examinations. The Regents are expected to discuss and vote on this topic at their next meeting being held on April 6-7, 2020.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMINATIONS

The College Board has announced that this year's AP exams will be given online so that students will be able to complete the test(s) at home. The test(s)) will be 45-minutes in length and will be focused on a reduced portion of the course content, omitting the last 25%. SATs

The College Board has announced that this year's June administration of the SAT and SAT Subject Tests are canceled.

If it's safe from a public health standpoint, weekend SAT administrations will be offered every month through the end of the calendar year, beginning in August. This includes a new administration in September and the previously scheduled tests on August 29, October 3, November 7, and December 5.
