

An Update on Distance Learning

Dear Irvington School Community,

I hope this message finds you well, having enjoyed the Passover and Easter holidays. While these holidays may have felt different during this time of social distancing, I do hope you were able to find some joy in connecting virtually with your family and friends. Surely the global battle with the COVID-19 pandemic will have lasting impacts on how we live and communicate. Over the past few weeks, we have all adapted our personal lives to include new required approaches and strategies to accomplish what we may have considered to be routine tasks before. Because there is nothing routine about teaching children, the Irvington UFSD has been adapting its approaches to teaching and learning during the current, extended closure. In prior communications, I have written about the evolution of our distance learning practices and today I am pleased to announce yet another positive shift.

Distance Learning Phase 3

Over the course of this week, the teachers in all of the Irvington schools will transition to providing live instruction and offering live support sessions utilizing Google Hangouts Meet. As a part of this transition, our special-area teachers, related service providers and other instructional personnel will also begin to provide live instructional experiences. Specific student-learning schedules are being finalized for use at each school and will be communicated by each school principal and posted on the District website as a new component of the <u>Guide to Distance Learning</u>. Parents and students are asked to please review these schedules as they will take effect on Monday, April 20th, with teachers reconnecting with their classes during the scheduled times. Like all transitions, I am sure there will be a few bumps along the way for students, parents and teachers alike. So, I thank you in advance for your patience and support during this time. Should you have questions regarding this enriched approach to teaching and learning, which we are referring to as Distance Learning Phase 3, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher or principal.

Supporting Our School Community

Just as our instructional and learning needs have changed, so have many aspects of our personal lives. This period of time has introduced many challenges for members of our school community due to the loss of jobs, illness or financial difficulties. Therefore, our unity as a school community is needed now more than ever. Our school district has been providing assistance to many families by offering meals and other items they needed to navigate difficulties even before the onset of the current situation and will continue to do so. The Village of Irvington Recreation Department and the PTSA have been amazing partners in this work. However, their efforts require support.
