Ensure the safety and well-being of all students and employees.


Promote equity and accessibility to learning for all students.

Some students 100% onsite






First Choice by Building (percentage of responses)

Flex Days:

- Remote learning for all students with 2 ½ hours teacher contact time
- Elementary: Specials, small group, conferences
- Secondary: Alternate periods 0-4 one week, periods 5-9 the next
- 2 ¹/₂ hours committee meetings, professional learning and collaboration



Considerations for Establishing Cohorts

- Meeting DOH guidelines for health and safety
- Meeting NYSED guidelines regarding serving students with the highest needs
- Meeting students course requests where possible (IMS/IHS)



Proposed Cohorts

- Cohort A
 - Last names beginning with **A through L**
 - Onsite Learning Monday and Tuesday
 - Distance Learning Wednesday through Friday

Cohort B

- Last names beginning with **M through Z**
- Onsite Learning Thursday and Friday
- Distance Learning Monday through Wednesday

• Cohort C

• Special class students onsite Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday

In order to meet DOH guidelines, some class and schedule changes may be required.

Phased in Reopening

- 9/8-9/11 100% Distance Learning
 - Staff and families have time to quarantine after returning from trips to other states
 - Begin to establish classroom community with students in home environment
 - Provide introduction to new safety procedures
 - Defer on-site learning until air conditioners are not needed
- 9/14-9/18 Transition to Alternating Attendance Model
 - Establish teacher-student relationships with small groups
 - Bring in half of a cohort per day for the first week to learn transportation procedures, classroom procedures, building traffic patterns
 - Reduced exposure with fewer people in buildings
- 9/21 Full implementation of Alternating Attendance Model (AA Flex BB)

Distance Learning Design

While participating in Distance Learning:

- All students will participate in regular, scheduled synchronous learning following an assigned schedule
- Students at home will be learning along with students who are on-site
- Instruction will follow the pacing of on-site learning with similar assignments targeting the same learning objectives
- Small group and whole group synchronous learning will be scheduled

Distance Learning Design, Continued

While participating in Distance Learning:

- Technologies are being explored to provide live streaming of the classroom for students learning from home
- Google Classroom and Google Meet will be utilized to support instruction and maintain effective communication
- Teachers will utilize technology such as Google applications and streaming as instructional strategies. However, details are still being finalized.

Required Daily Health Screenings

To provide for the health and safety of all school community members:

- Staff members will complete a daily health survey before reporting to work
- Parents will be required to complete a daily health survey prior to their child leaving for school.
- Surveys will include:
 - Temperature taking
 - Symptoms survey
 - Travel survey
 - Attestation to accuracy of information provided
- Nurses will monitor health daily and will implement quarantine procedures when necessary



Health and Safety in School

- All students and staff will wear masks
 - Regular mask breaks will be provided
- Schools will periodically sanitize all high-contact surfaces
- Proper hygiene practices will be mandated
- Traffic control process will be implemented (hallways and stairways)
- Lunch will be served in classrooms where possible to limit interaction
- Alternate locations will be added for secondary meal distribution/eating
- Meals will be available for remote learners
- Hand sanitizing and hand washing stations will be added throughout each school
- Visitors to schools will be limited
 - Meetings will take place virtually when possible



Health and Safety on School Buses

- All students and staff will wear masks
- Social distancing will be implemented where possible
- Buses will be wiped down between routes with a thorough cleaning daily
- Siblings will be required to share seats
- Completion of health survey prior to reporting to bus stops
